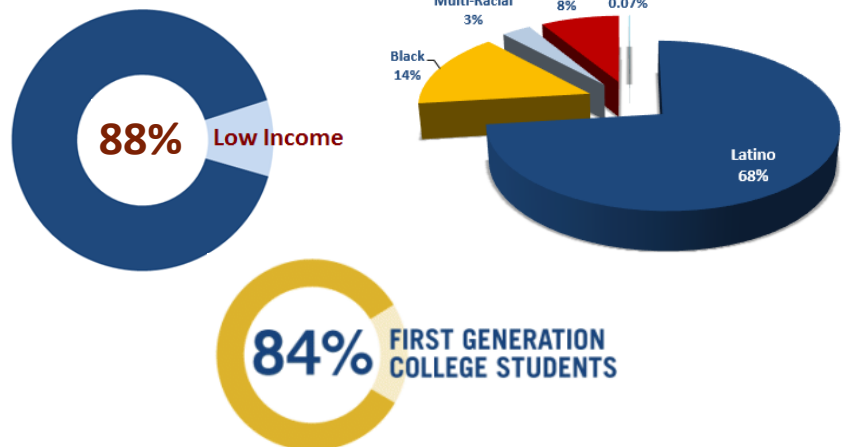

### Campus Overview

At Noble, our mission is to instill in our students, through both love and high expectations, the scholarship, discipline, and honor they will need to be college ready and have access to a life rich with options.

Noble Street College Prep is the first campus of the high-performing Noble Network of Charter Schools, graduating our first class in 2003. Noble students engage in a rigorous academic program, spend more time in class than typical high school students, commit to following a strict set of rules, and act with honor and respect as they pursue the dream of college success. Our Class of 2018 averaged a 20.23 composite ACT score with 100% of students testing in June 2017 and 1060 SAT score with 99% of students testing in April 2017.

### Student Body



Noble Street College Prep has a total student body of X students including a senior class of 133. All students are admitted via lottery with the only requirement being that they complete the application on time and successfully graduate 8th grade. At Noble, students attend an extended school day and year. The majority of our students spend additional hours, before and after school, attending teachers' office hours or participating in extra-curriculars. **No tuition or academic examination is required to enroll.**

**Transcript Information:** Our academic year is divided into two semesters with official grades reported in late January and mid-June. Students are required to pass all of their courses before being promoted to the next grade. For pass/fail courses, students must earn a 90%. Weighted class rankings are included in transcripts to assist in candidate evaluation.

**Discipline Code:** Due to the strong nature of our discipline code, it is our policy not to report disciplinary infractions to colleges.

**^Language:** All seniors will receive the equivalent of 2 years of Spanish by taking a double block each semester.

**^Enrichment:** Students must earn 1.0 enrichment credits to graduate from Noble. Enrichment credits are earned through after-school programs, pre-college summer programs, and other extracurricular activities. Please note: Noble Street places a strong emphasis on students attending teachers' office hours after school, and many students have to commute long distances to school. For these and other reasons, many of our students are involved in fewer extracurricular activities than the average high school student.

**^Fitness & Leadership:** Students must pass a physical fitness test in order to promote and graduate. This includes push-ups, curl-ups, and a mile run. Students must pass all three tests as well as a written health and fitness test.

**Alumni Support:** Our commitment to our students' success does not end with their high school graduation. We have a dedicated Alumni Coordinator who provides individualized support and tracks alumni progress.
