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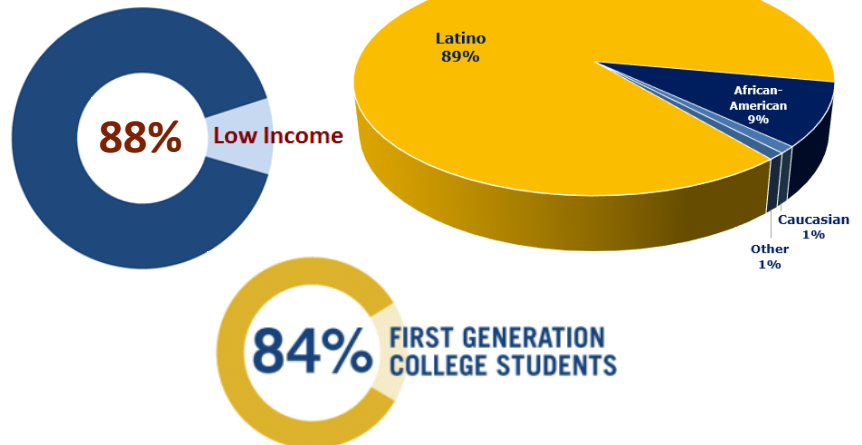
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## Campus Overview

At Noble, our mission is to instill in our students, through both love and high expectations, the scholarship, discipline and honor they will need to be college ready and have access to a life rich with options.

Noble Street College Prep is the first campus of the high-performing Noble Network of Charter Schools, graduating our first class in 2003. Noble students engage in a rigorous academic program, spend more time in class than typical high school students, commit to following a strict set of rules and act with honor and respect as they pursue the dream of college success. Our Class of 2017 averaged a 20.8 composite ACT score with 100% of scholars testing in May 2016.

## Student Body



Noble Street College Prep has a total student body of 669 students including a senior class of 144. All students are admitted via lottery with the only requirement being that they complete the application on time and successfully graduate 8th grade. At Noble, students attend an extended school day and year. The majority of our students spend additional hours, after school, attending teachers' office hours or participating in extra-curriculars. **No tuition or academic examination is required to enroll.**

**Transcript Information:** Our academic year is divided into two semesters with official grades reported in late January and mid-June. Students are required to pass all of their courses before being promoted to the next grade. For pass/fail courses, students must earn a 90%. In 2016-2017 Noble Street will not report **class rank**. Please see weighted grade distribution for the Class of 2017 to help assist in candidate evaluation below.

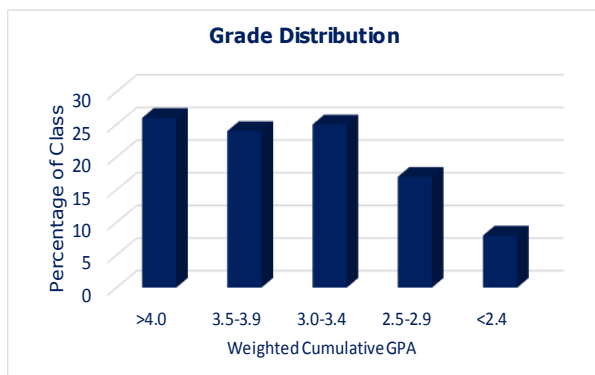
**Discipline Code:** Due to the strong nature of our discipline code, it is our policy not to report disciplinary infractions to colleges.

**Language:** Noble Street has recently undergone a curriculum shift in our language department by offering Spanish instead of Russian. All seniors will receive the equivalent of 2 years of Spanish by taking a full credit each semester.

**Enrichment:** Enrichment credits are earned through after-school programs, pre-college summer programs, and other extracurricular activities. Please note: Noble Street places a strong emphasis on students attending teachers' office hours after school, and many students have to commute long distances to school. For these and other reasons, many of our students are involved in fewer extracurricular activities than the average high school student.

**Fitness & Leadership:** Students must pass a physical fitness test in order to promote and graduate. This includes push-ups, curl-ups, and a mile run. Students must pass all three tests as well as a written health and fitness test.

**Alumni Support:** Our commitment to our students' success does not end with their high school graduation. We have a dedicated Alumni Coordinator who provides individualized support and tracks alumni progress.
